

## *FAA ARCHITECTURE TO BEGIN PLANNING NEW LIBRARY BUILDING*

FFA Architecture has been retained by the Fort Regional Library (FVRL) District to begin the planning (Building Pre-Design Program) for a new facility in Woodland.

On June 27th, FFA will be conducting four meetings in Woodland. These will be just the first in a series. The next date for the FFA Architecture Community Meeting is for July 8, 2014, at 6:30pm, in the Community Center. There will be another meeting in early fall when they will present us with their recommendations.

June 27th meetings are scheduled as follows:

- 1) FFA will meet with the Friends at 10am.
- 2) At 12pm, the Woodland Library Staff will meet with FFA.
- 3) At 2pm, FFA will meet with the Hispanic Community Focus Group.
- 4) At 6:30pm, the Town Hall meeting with FFA is open to the public.

The meetings will be held in the Community Center, next door to the Woodland Community Library, located at 770 Park Street, Woodland.

This process will help those of us most vested in the new library building to identify what that building will look like, what facilities it should include as well as produce a feasibility analysis of potential sites on which to place the new library.

This is a very exciting development and we should all be proud that we have come this far in the process!

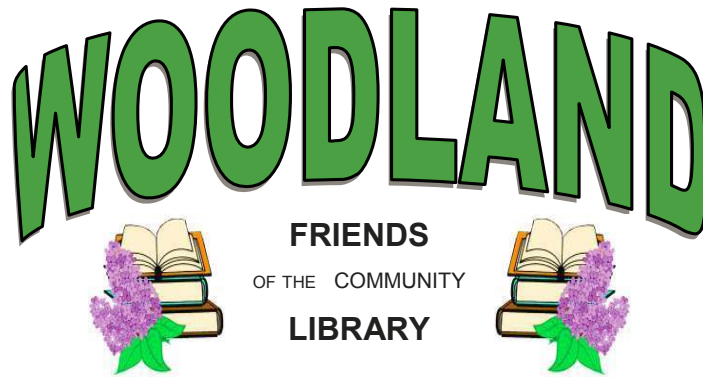
